FACULTY BIOGRAPHIES

John Leubsdorf is a Professor at Rutgers Law School-Newark and has also taught at Boston University, Columbia, Cardozo, Cornell, and the University of California-Berkeley. He has published widely in fields including Legal Ethics and Civil Procedure and was Associate Reporter for the American Law Institute's Restatement of the Law Governing Lawyers. Before teaching, he attended Harvard Law School (where he was Articles Editor of the Harvard Law Review), clerked for a federal appellate judge, and litigated as an associate and partner at Foley, Hoag & Eliot in Boston.

Dr. Lauris C. Kaldjian is an Associate Professor in the Department of Internal Medicine, and the Director of the Program in Biomedical Ethics and Medical Humanities, at the University of Iowa Carver College of Medicine. He received his B.S. and M.D. from the University of Michigan, a B.A. from Oxford University, and an M.Div. and Ph.D. in ethics from Yale University. He did his residency and fellowship training at Yale in internal medicine and infectious diseases. Dr. Kaldjian practices general internal medicine and teaches at the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics. In the College of Medicine he directs the Healthcare Ethics, Law and Policy course for second-year medical students. His current research focuses on: (1) disclosure of medical errors; (2) surrogate decision-making in dementia; (3) goals of care in clinical decision-making; and (4) the relationship between physicians' personal beliefs and professional ethics. In 2002 Dr. Kaldjian received a Generalist Physician Faculty Scholars award from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, and from 2003-2006 he was the Law & Ethics column editor for *Johns Hopkins Advanced Studies in Medicine*.

Dr. Amy Marie Haddad received her B.S.N. from Creighton University, her M.S.N. from the University of Nebraska Medical Center, and her Ph.D. in adult and continuing education from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. She is the Director of the Center for Health Policy and Ethics at Creighton University and the Dr. C.C. and Mabel L. Criss Endowed Chair in Health Sciences. She teaches ethics in pharmacy and related health sciences at Creighton University. Her publications include more than 15 book chapters and 50 journal articles and several books. She has presented at professional conferences nationally and internationally for most of her career. She was selected in 2001 for the national Carnegie Scholars program of the Carnegie Center for the Advancement of the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning. She is the 2003 winner of the Robert K. Chalmers Distinguished Pharmacy Educator Award of the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy.

Honorable Charles R. Wolle is Senior Judge of the United States District Court for the Southern District of Iowa, appointed for life by President Ronald Reagan to term beginning 1987. Judge Wolle received an A.B. degree from Harvard College and a J.D. with honors from the University of Iowa College of Law where he was also a Notes Editor for the *Iowa Law Review*. He practiced law in Sioux City, Iowa, and is a Fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers. He served as Judge of the Iowa District Court, Third Judicial District, and served as Justice of the Iowa Supreme Court before appointment to the Federal bench. He has been a long-time instructor at the National Judicial College.
